Aim

To develop an effective and sustainable model of Education Information and Support.

To support 116 women diagnosed with HIV through ante-natal care.

In line with Positively-UK's fundamental ethos of peer support, the project is led by HIV positive women and an advisory group made up of both healthcare professionals and women living with HIV

Women diagnosed antenatally
Women living with HIV and pregnant
Women living with HIV and considering pregnancy



Outputs

Recruitment and training of 'Mentor Mothers'
One to one support
Group support and workshops at PW and Nationally
Provision of information
Publication of resources



Outcomes

Sustain minimal mother to child transmission

Reduced partner co-infection/onward transmission

Reduced isolation

Improve women's experience

Improved access to services and reduce numbers of 'lost to follow-up'

Reduced dependency*

Improved mother and baby healthcare

Leadership of positive women - GIPA

Informing policy

Evaluation

^{*}To enable women to engage as equal partners in their healthcare, in taking on ownership of their pregnancy in order to reduce women's total dependency on healthcare providers
